How to Use a QR Code Reader

In this tutorial you're going to learn how to scan a QR code and a couple other tips about using a QR code reader app. I've created a QR code that links to websmartboomer.com and I'm going to use my iPad and the QR Code Reader and Scanner app to scan the QR code. First, I open the app. Now when I opened the app the first time I used it I was given the option of allowing it to access my camera or not, and I did, of course, otherwise it wouldn't work. But now it has my permission and so it doesn't ask me again. Next, I just hold up the iPad camera to the QR code and, as you can see, it automatically scans it and as soon as it can it takes me to view the website. You have to be connected to the internet for this to work. It'll scan the code if you're offline but it won't be able to open links. There it is. Now one more thing about this app — and this is a typical feature with QR code readers — it stores a history of your scans. Just tap the History button and you can view, access, and manage your information from there.
